WEB-BASED MEMBERSHIP SYSTEM (WMS)

WMS Version 2 has been delayed because all National Office Technical Staff members were working full-time on the recent Recruitment Campaign. However, the draft User's Manual for this new version has been written and was released for review at the end of March. The Manual is quite good and will need only minor revision before going to a final version. This review also confirmed several significant software flaws and the developer has been tasked to fix the problems. Should everything be resolved, Version 2 should be ready for acceptance testing this summer.

The good news is that Version 1, despite its inherent limitations, continues to function well and adequately handled the recent influx of about 16,000 new members resulting from the Recruitment Campaign.
