Date/Time: Thursday, March 28, 2013 , Annual General Meeting starts 1100 AM.


Location: Coast Bastion Inn, 11 Bastion St., Nanaimo, B.C.

Directions: Located in downtown Nanaimo, Bastion St and Front St. Parkade next door.


Meeting/Lunch: Doors open at 10:00 AM. The Annual General Meeting will start at 11:00 AM followed by the installation of Officers. There will be a short presentation on a program called "Find First". A Luncheon Buffet will be served after the meeting is adjourned, including - Salads, Roast Sirloin with mushroom sauce, Vegetarian Lasagna, Vegetables, Potatoes, Regular & Decaffeinated Coffee & Tea. Cost, including gratuities and tax, will be **\$21.00** per member and **\$23.00 for non-members**, payable at the door on arrival.

Presentation - Our speaker for the March AGM will be D'Arcy Falkiner or Ken Neden of Arrowsmith Search and Rescue. They will give a short presentation about "Find First", a program which uses the "Project Lifesaver" system to locate people that have wandered away from their caregivers. Search and Rescue responds by tracking a small transmitter that the individual wears on their wrist.



The GST/HST debacle was overturned, and that was a good moment. FSNA was able to re-file our tax returns for the refund which was received on February 13, 2013. Hopefully that is the end of that scenario.

There is a host of activity leading up to the 50th Anniversary of FSNA and the National Congress in Ottawa June 18-20, 2013. Some of that activity is centered around the new Non-For-Profit Act (Bill C14), which will result in a change in our By-Laws, and possibly our Association name and logo. Basically, it will change the way we do business. Challenging times are ahead of us, for sure.

Another area of major discussion will be the report/recommendations of the Dues Committee,

and the impact that will have on our daily operations.

The recruitment campaign for new members was delayed until January, which set us back in terms of acquiring new members, and the possibility of adding new financial assets to our operation. However, new memberships began arriving late-February.

On a Regional level we are moving forward in the training of our Executive volunteers. There is a training session scheduled this May in Chilliwack that hopefully will see us send four of our executive for those training sessions. I firmly believe that in order to best provide for our membership, we need and insist that our Executive volunteers providing advice and advocacy do so with all the training available.

As of our latest Membership report, we have almost 1900 active members. Of those approximately 1900 members, we are only asking for about four- to- six new volunteers to help us carry on with the tasks necessary to continue our high standard of service to you, our members.

Al Heinrich, past President of our Branch and now National Director, is seeking re-election at the National Congress in Ottawa this coming June.


John Finn, PAO (Provincial Advocacy Officer), is seeking election as 3rd Vice-President National.

How the Registration System Works

Have you ever wondered how the Registration System for our quarterly meetings works? Here is a glimpse into the magic behind the curtain.

It starts with the volunteers who phone their assigned list of members starting Thursday, two weeks before the day of the meeting. They have four days to reach their people before they need to pass along their

list of attendees to their Phone Captains, on Sunday. (A plea on behalf of the phoners, if you are a

snowbird please let them know so that they don't worry when they cannot reach you.) Monday is my busy day as I await the input from the seven Phone Captains. This is the day I start to compile the list for the volunteers who greet you at the meeting room door. Please do not call me before Tuesday as I have nothing to amend and you risk me losing your message to either add your name to the list or to take it off. Those members who have requested that they not be called and decide that they would like to attend are the only exception to this rule. Please identify yourself as such so I don't go looking for you on the phoners' sheets. We have approximately 1300 households and I cannot take individual replies from each one of you. Al Tully has been providing this service for the past three years and has developed a relationship with various venues in the area that are capable of

handling the large numbers that attend the lunches and business meetings. This he does with the co-ordination of a dedicated group of Directors and volunteers that assist in giving us all a great experience.

Although retired from two Tourism Boards the contacts that he has made have now also become part of his network in arranging these meetings. Al will be confirming venues and meal costs for the last two meetings of this year.

In all FSNA luncheon functions the host has graciously waived any charges for room rentals thus saving our members extra costs added to the meals, and the prices we are paying also include HST and a 15% gratuity, which provides us with good buffets, or a sit down lunch, and coffee service prior to the meeting. For the upcoming event at the Coast Bastion management has waived a \$950.00 charge that is the rate for the room rental only. They also do not charge for audio visual equipment that we use.

The support comes from the dedication of the Telephone Director, who arranges schedules for the phone Captains and phoners that get in touch with you, the Registration Director, who co-ordinates the names of those attending the meet-

number of attendees to the Program Director at our Thursday Executive meeting. He then notifies the venue a week in advance of the numbers and that is the number of meals we are billed for.

If you have said that you would attend and then didn't, you are still responsible for the cost. Upon reimbursement to the Branch you will remain in good standing with reference to future meal bookings. Those in arrears can still attend meetings but will not be served a meal. [Check out our new meeting policy.](#)

We try to find venues that will accommodate all of the members who wish to attend but there are very few in our area that can hold 200 people and provide a quality meal at a reasonable price. On one occasion we found that there were more attendees than the facility could accept, so the decision was made to reduce the numbers by eliminating the guests. This has now become the policy. We will let you know in the Newsletter, if the venue has a limited capacity.

For those of you who were sure that they gave their name to their phoner but are not on the attendee list, there is a reason for that. As mentioned previously, we pay for the number of meals booked by the Program Director, not the number of meals eaten. It was decided that each member could forget three times before their name would not be added to the list. This applies even if you pay for the missed meal. If you are very forgetful we do not want you to be out of pocket after the third meeting. This does not mean that you are unwelcome, just that you do not have a guaranteed meal. To date, we have been able to meet the requirements of the additional attendees.

Hope this takes some of the mystery out of the Registration system for you.

Changes to Distribution of the 2012 Tax Package

The Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) is no longer automatically mailing general income tax and benefit packages and has discontinued its TELEFILE service (telephone filing).

Although the CRA did not publicly announce its new procedure, it has started to send letters to taxpayers to inform them that they can request to receive the package by mail or obtain one from Canada Post outlets.

The is the only item currently posted on the CRA’s Web site about the procedure:

2012 tax package - You can order a printed copy using this online order form, however the ordered packages will only be mailed starting **February 4, 2013**. The 2012 General income tax and benefit package will be available at Canada Post and Service Canada outlets as of **February 4, 2013**. Changes In Membership Dues

FSNA has been informed by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) that, contrary to an earlier ruling, the Association is **not** required to charge the goods and services/harmonized sales tax (GST/HST) on membership dues. Therefore, dues for 2013 remain unchanged at \$44.40 for Double, \$34.20 for Single and \$15.00 for Associate.
